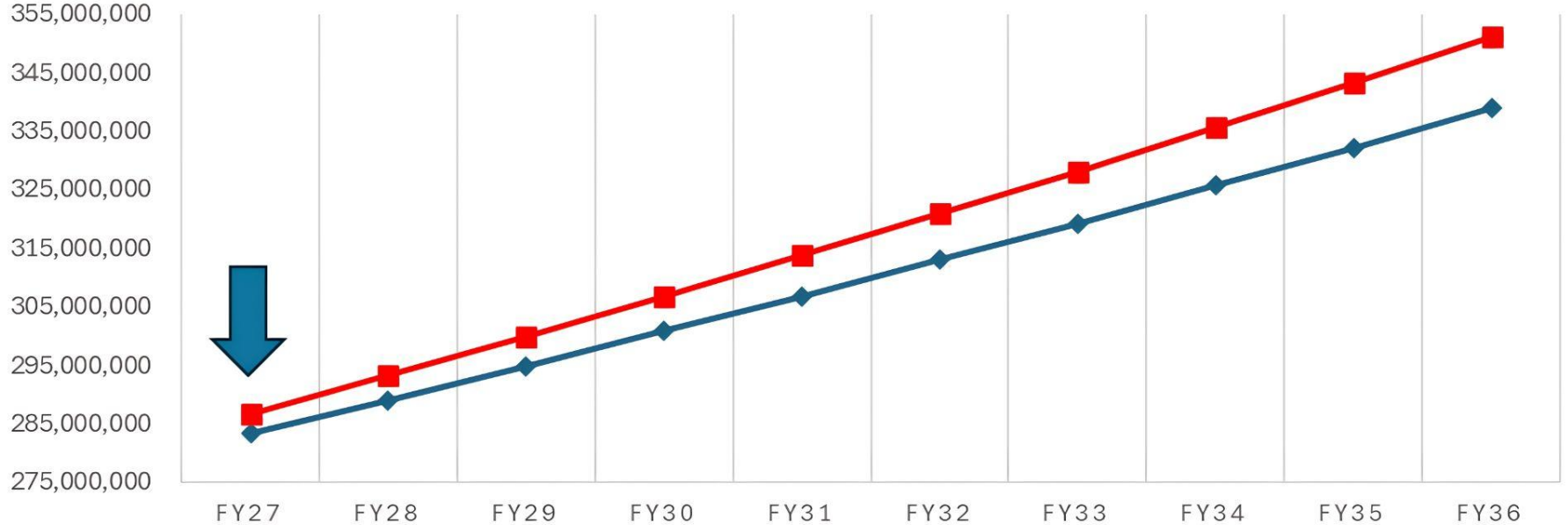

This is a multi-year problem

- Costs are rising faster than inflation and faster than funding
- Legislative actions - senior tax freeze, Hancock rollback pressure – has reduced our ability to collect
- Future students will feel impact of less staff, programs, services, opportunities

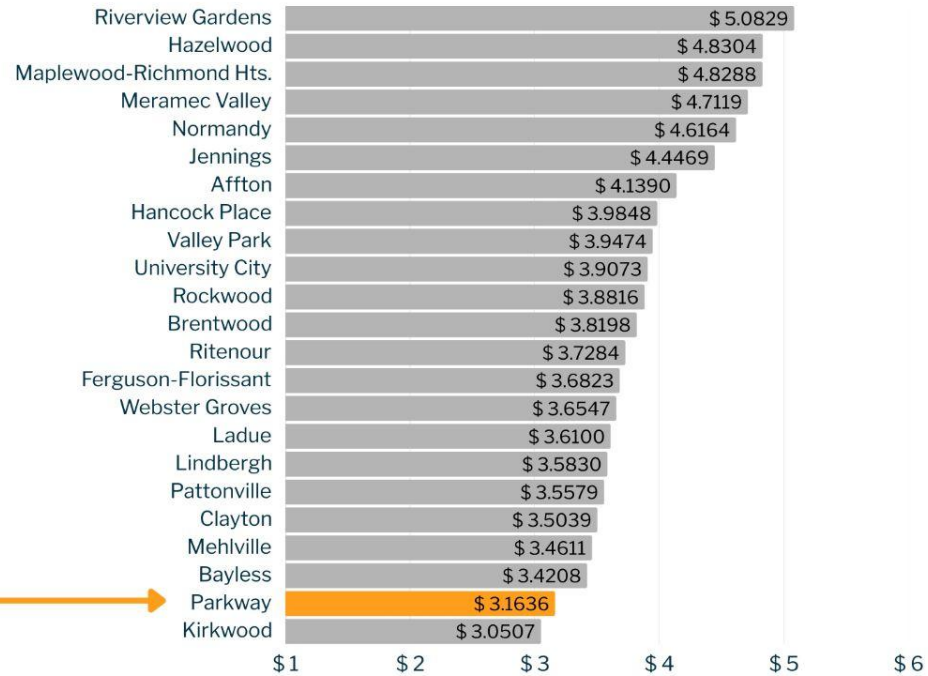

State – **\$835**

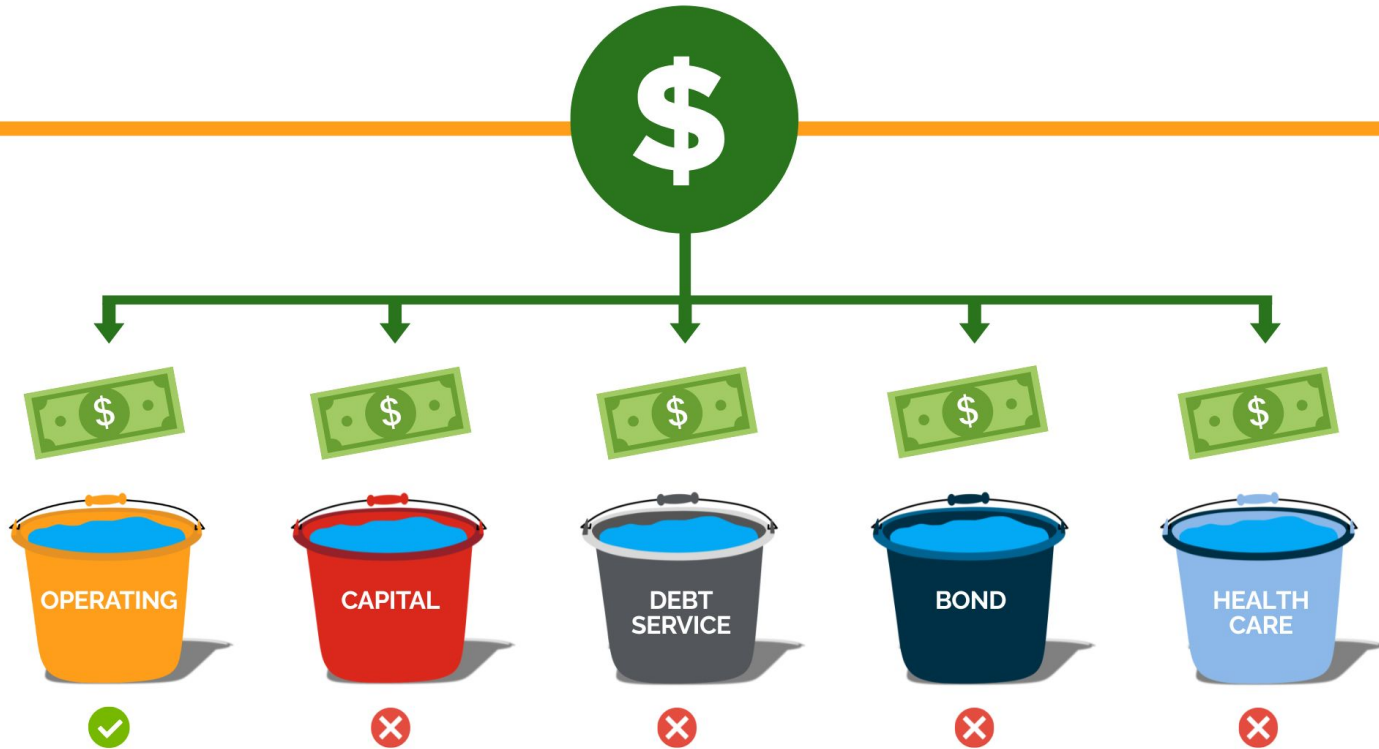
Federal – **\$285**

Other – **\$32**



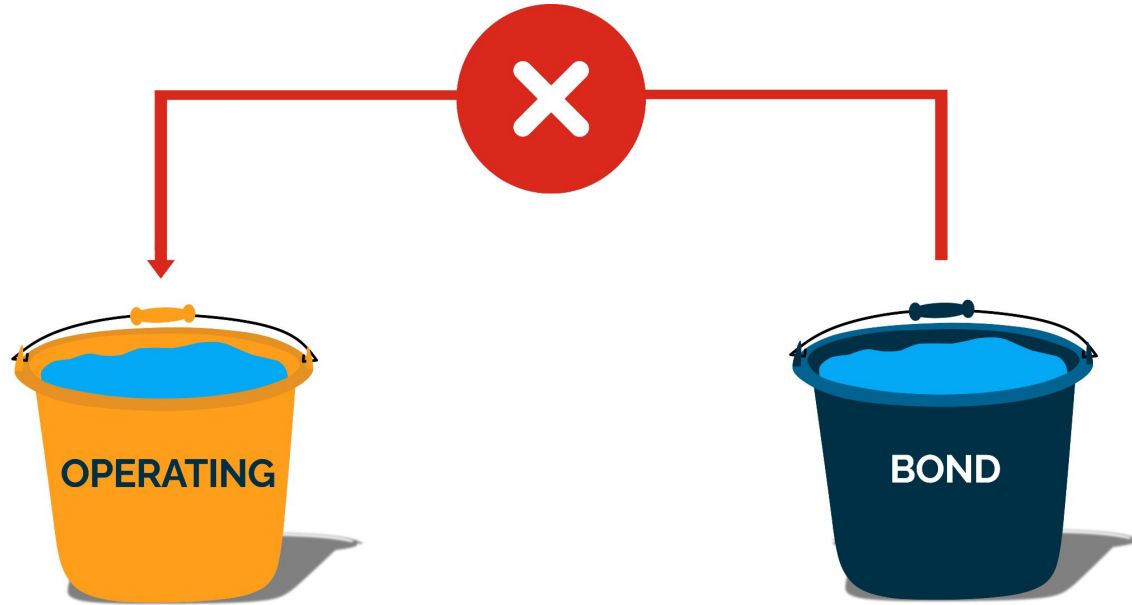
All funds: A total picture



- ✓ Operating funds can support other buckets
- ✗ By law, restricted funds cannot be used for any other buckets

Bond funds are legally restricted

For example, 2022 Prop S funds cannot be used for supplies or salaries

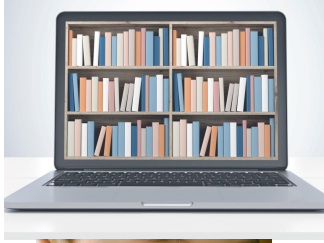

Current Fiscal Storm

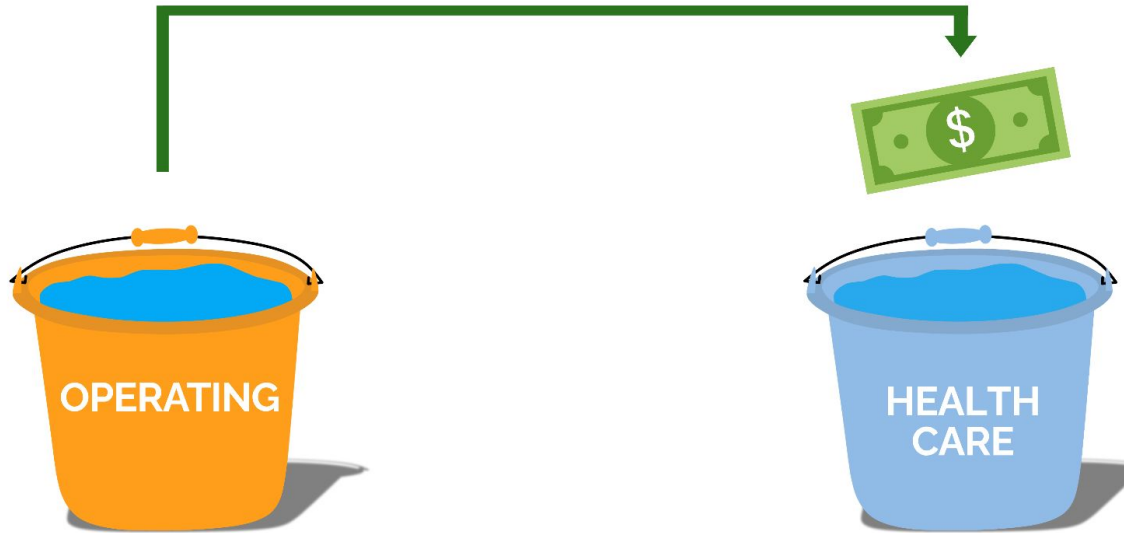
- Rapid increase in costs for basics

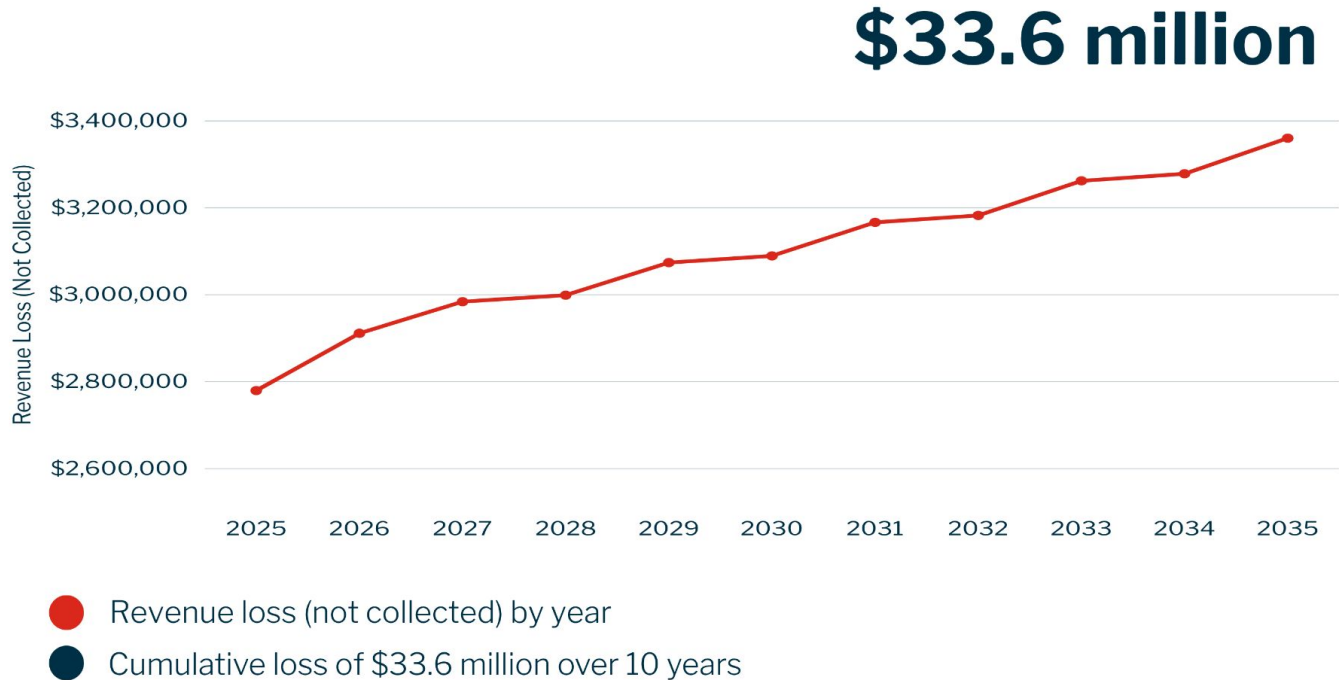

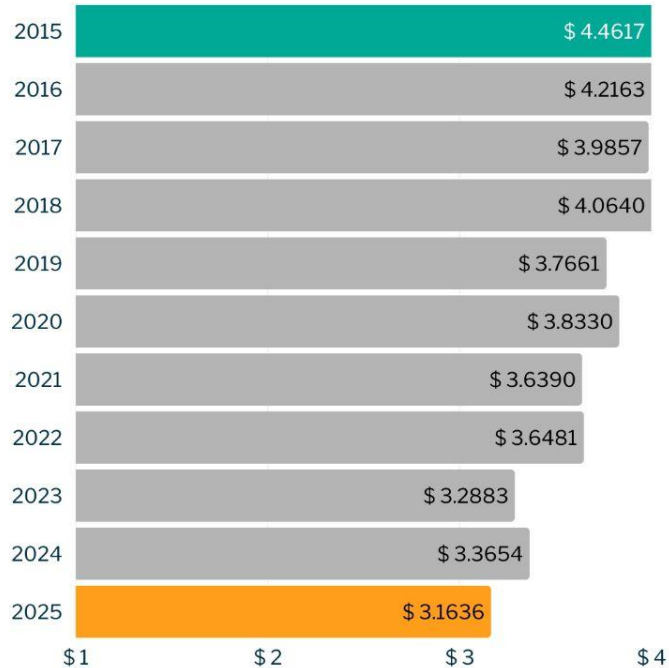

A Double Whammy For Parkway

Tax freeze: reduces growth in funding, even when property assessments rise

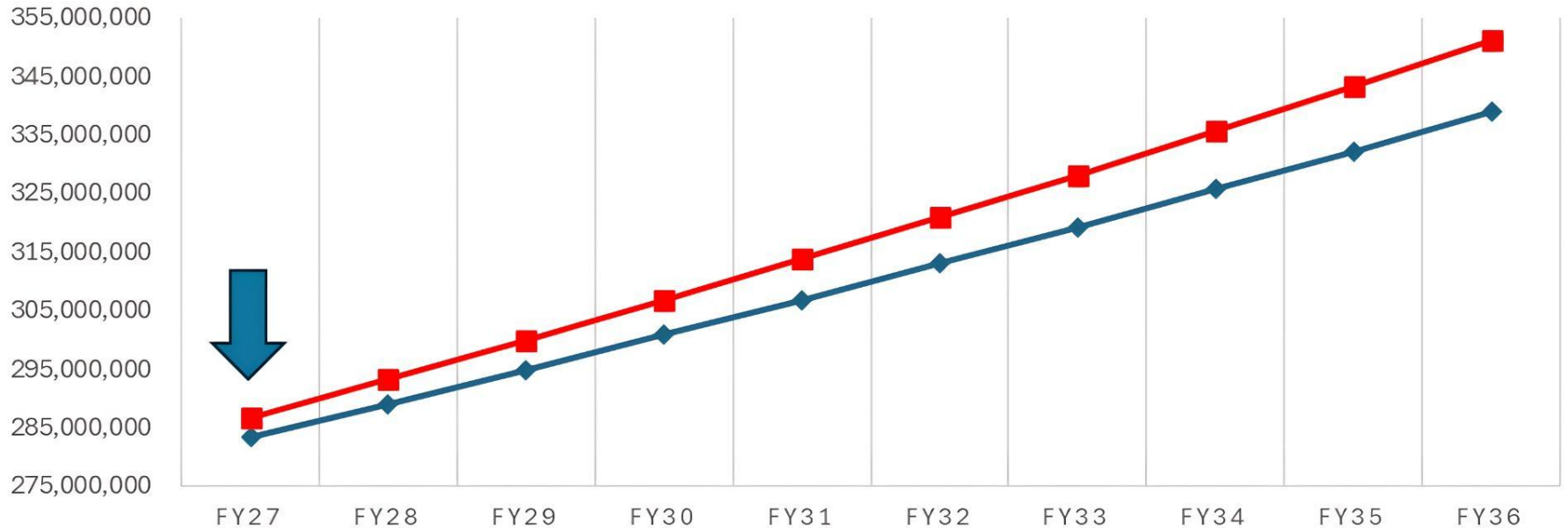
Hancock: when assessments rise, pushes our tax rate down even if we can't collect the funding

Together, they create a double whammy

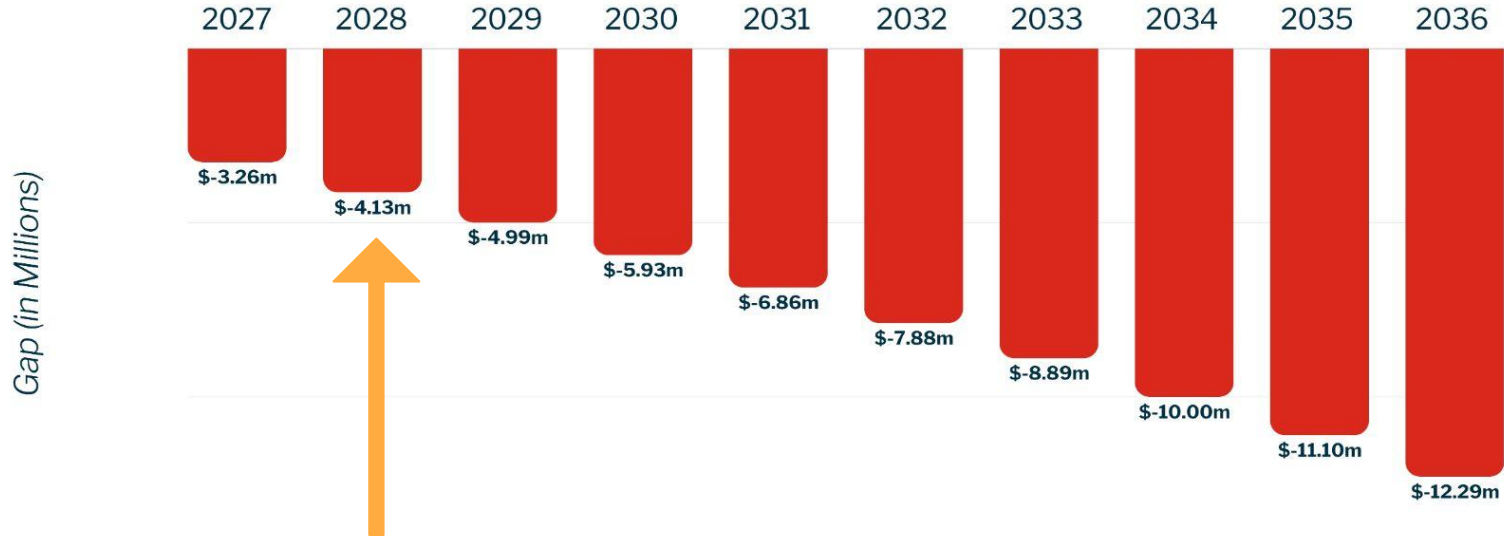
The Challenge

The Funding Shortfall



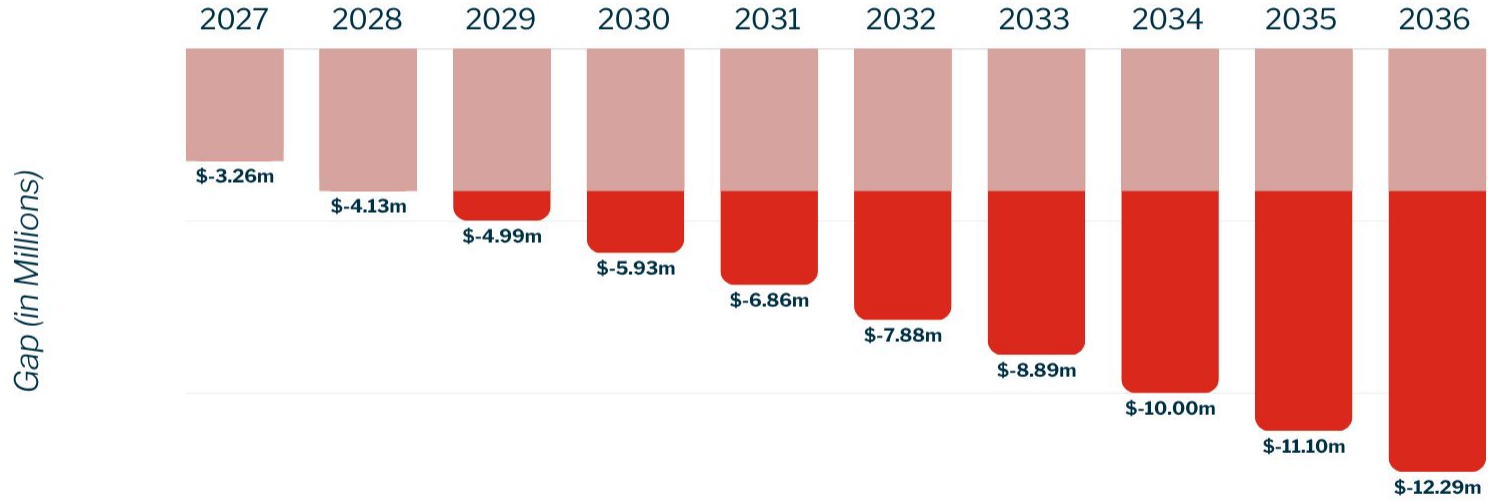
What does a \$4.1 million funding shortfall equate to?

- **Half of Fine Arts Programs**
OR
- **All Transportation and all Athletics**
OR
- **30 Administrators**
OR
- **51 Teachers**
OR
- **89 Support Staff**

These are examples to illustrate scale, not proposed cuts.



\$4.1 million doesn't close the shortfall long-term

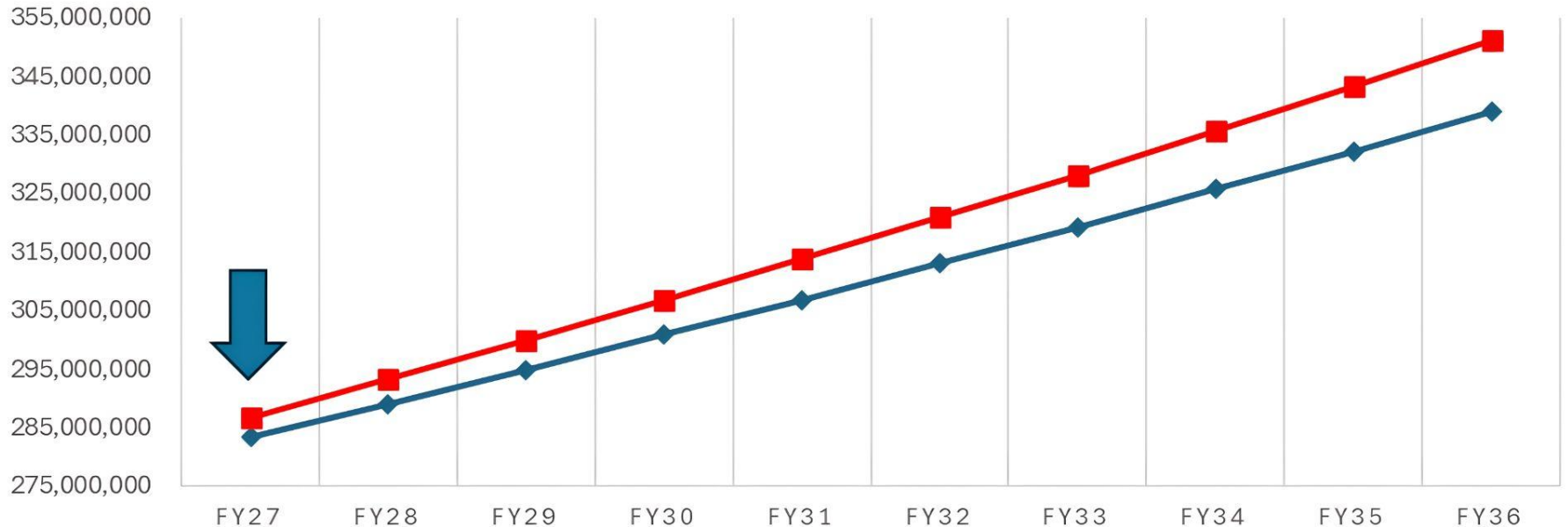

10-year forecast

Operating Funding Operating Expense



Cuts that protected students and classrooms 2025-26

- 10% reduction in supplies and services
- Some vacant positions left unfilled
- Reduced professional development
- Reduced building and department budgets

= \$12.7 million

Cuts planned to protect students and classrooms 2026-27

- Reducing building and department budgets even more
- A funding shortfall begins in 2027-28
- Strong reserves can cover shortfall in short-term, but this is not sustainable

= \$2.7 million

If cuts are part of the solution, how do we prioritize?

So far, we have:

- Protected students and the classroom
- Avoided cuts that impact safety or instruction
- Reduced non-classroom spending before direct student opportunities

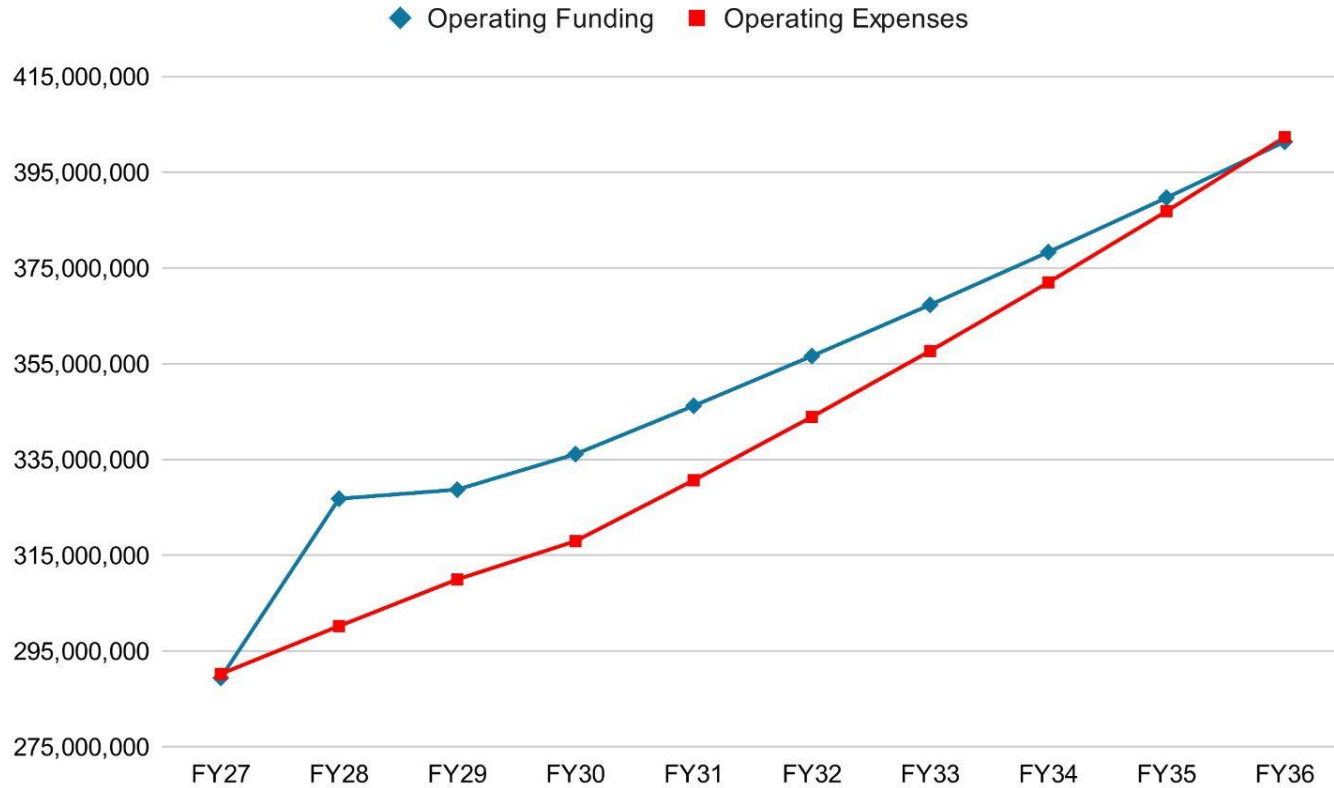
After multiple years of reductions, future cuts will be harder to make without impacting students

What would a 46-cent tax increase protect?

- Safe and secure schools
- High-quality teachers and staff
- Top-rated status in St. Louis area

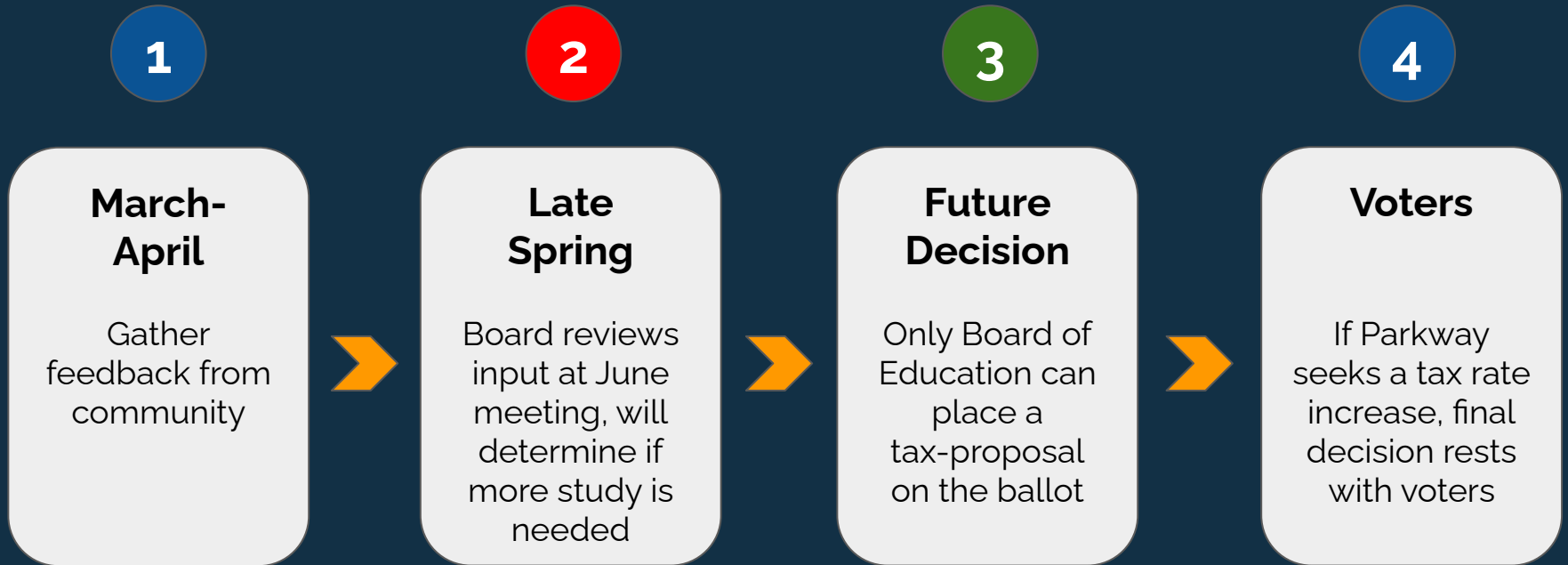
\$7 per week for owner of \$400K home

A sustainable approach



With a 46-cent increase, our tax rate would be **middle of the pack** compared with other districts
